**Our tip:** Red is considered the colour of dementia, because it stimulates the appetite and creates orientation. It is the colour that dementia patients can still recognise well even after a long course of the disease.

The plates, bowls, cups and boards are designed to be intuitive for all. The features hidden in the design provide additional relief for everyday challenges. This promotes independence and self-esteem. And, **what is practised daily is more easily remembered**.

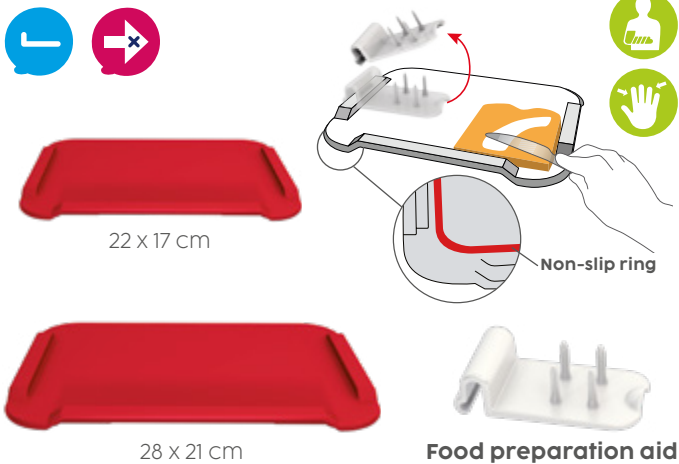

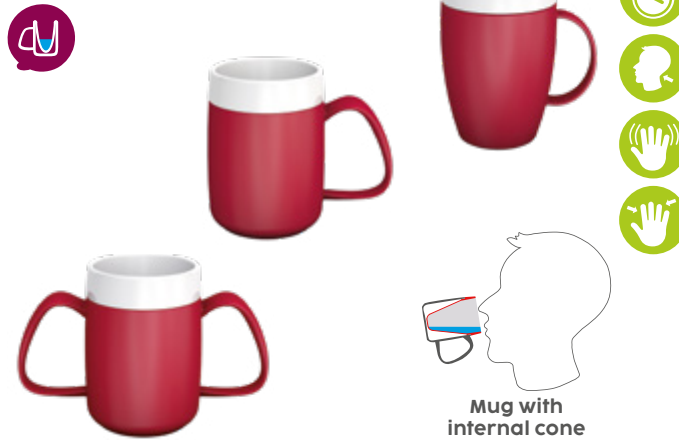

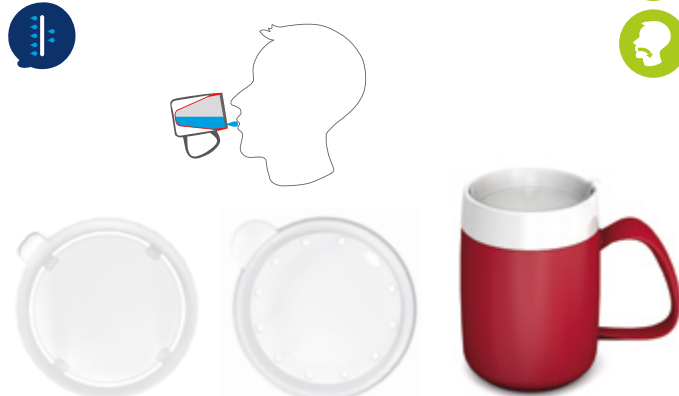
